Welcome to the Annual Convention of Columbia Council of Camera Clubs to be held in the historic and scenic Rogue Valley. SOPA, the host club, welcomes you. The lineup of field trips can be found on these pages with links to the sites.

This Year's Convention Has a Fun-Packed Portfolio of Field Trips for All Kinds of Subjects – from Neon to Insects!

The crown jewel for Ashland is its <u>Lithia Park</u>, shown above. Laid against the world renowned OSF-Oregon Shakespeare Festival, the Park is particularly splendid in fall.

There will be two scheduled sunrise, guided outings: Friday, the 6th and Saturday, the 7th. But you are also free to go on your own.

The shoot will include the Park and the adjoining Shakespeare complex with its famed Elizabethan Outdoor Theater.

The Park has two large greens, a band shell, two duck ponds, a spacious playground, tennis courts, community buildings and, in winter, an ice skating rink.

It also offers miles of easy to moderate hiking trails.
Lithia Park was designed by John McLaren, the same architect who planned San Francisco's Golden Gate Park. The Ashland Park, consisting of 93 acres, was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1982.

The Oregon Shakespeare Festival is a not-for-profit professional theatre founded in 1935. Its season runs from February through early November, and has three theaters: two indoor stages, the Angus Bowmer Theatre and the Thomas Theatre, and the flagship outdoor Allen Elizabethan Theatre, which opens in early June and runs through mid-October.

North Mountain Park & Ponds

If macro photography is your thing then the North Mountain Park Nature Center field trip is for you. Lots of insects, amphibians, and by the time of convention, leaves will be starting their migration to autumn colors. There is never a guarantee, but NMPNC is usually a good birding location. Located next to Bear Creek, the Park encompasses the Nature Center, Demonstration Gardens, ponds and several

acres of wildlife-friendly open space and trails. Typically there will be a good number of deer and smaller critters to greet you.

Two trips: Sunrise, about 6:30, on Friday and Saturday. Neal Thompson will be on hand to discuss macro techniques If macro photography is your thing then the North Mountain Park Nature Center trip is the place to be.

Wildlife Images

Last but not least! Wildlife Images in Grants Pass is the final and maybe best field trip in the portfolio. With its mission of saving wildlife, get up close and personal to a range of rescued animals, all striking in their beauty; each with a unique story.

The organization's clinic, animal sanctuary, and education center are located on 24 acres of land adjacent to the wild and scenic section of Oregon's famous Rogue River. Badgers, bobcats, and bears oh my! Yes, you will see all of these animals and many more.

This walking tour lasts approximately 1.5 hours with a casual pace over gentle terrain.

Requires a minimum of 10 participants and is limited to a maximum of 25 on Sunday, the 8th at 10:00 am. The \$15 entry ticket to be paid in advance includes a donation.
